REGARDING: "Buy AmericA" Requirements for Steel Framing

Typically, <u>"Buy America"</u> refers to the *Buy America, Surface Transportation Act of 1982*. However, there are five other regulations with very similar provisions that are commonly referred to as "Buy America". List as follows:

- 1. Buy America, Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982 (STAA)
- 2. American Iron and Steel Requirements (AIS) (part of Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2014)
- 3. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) (49 U.S.C. 50101)
- 4. Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) (49 U.S.C. 24405)
- 5. National Railroad Passenger Corporation (AMTRAK) (49 U.S.C. 24305)
- 6. Federal Transit Administration (FTA) (49 U.S.C. 5323)

These regulations require 100% domestic made steel, meaning that all steel making processes, excluding the extraction and mining of the raw materials must take place in the United States. You can find more information on the steel making process here: Steelmaking - worldsteel.org. Note that ClarkDietrich is not a steel mill, we purchase hot rolled finished and coated coils from steel mills, which we use to manufacture our cold-formed steel framing products in plants that are located in the United States.

Generally, ClarkDietrich can fulfill all <u>Buy America</u> orders. Occasionally, due to the vast number of gauges, and skews associated with a project, we may not have all the proper coils in stock at your desired manufacturing location. In this case, special order coils will need to be purchased, which could cause longer lead times and upcharges for those specific products.

NOTE: For ClarkDietrich to supply <u>Buy America</u> compliant steel, this will need to be communicated to us when requesting a quotation or placing and order so we can Red Flag your order and apply the proper coils to the order. For verification, Steel Mill Certificates can be supplied after the order has been produced.
